First, we must believe the historical facts about Jesus Christ found in God's Word, the Bible: Jesus died on the cross for our sins, and God raised Him from the dead, giving Him an immortal body, the kind He has promised to give us when He returns from heaven to rule the earth.

Secondly, God wants each of us to make a confession with our mouths (out loud) that Jesus Christ is our personal Lord and Savior, and one day He is taking us to Heaven.

This is accomplished by praying the following prayer:

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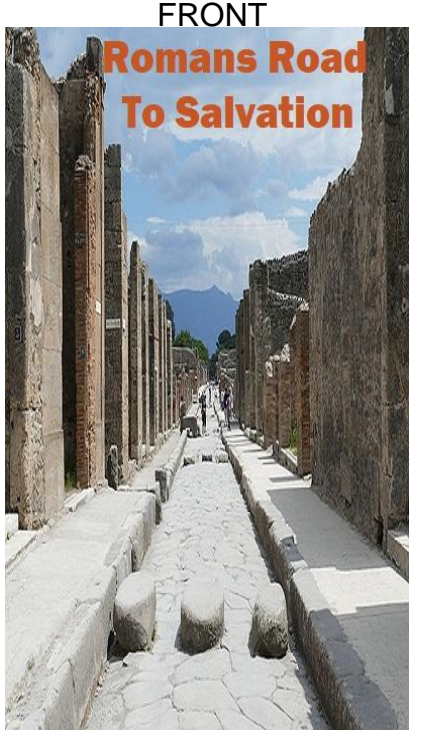

A key to the success and longevity of the Roman Empire was an expansive system of roads. The first proper Roman road, the Appian Way, was constructed in 312 BC to provide fast, reliable communications and supply links, in wars with the well armed Samnites. Historian Logan Thompson states, "This route followed a remarkably straight, direct, well-drained 122 mile course, firmly topped with neatly fashioned blocks of volcanic lava. It is commendable that Roman engineers and surveyors managed, with their first-ever route, to incorporate most of the construction principles so closely followed during the next 700 years. Thereafter, route networks constantly expanded in every direction, like the spokes of a wheel, with Rome as a hub."
